Arblu presents Tuby project at the Salone del Mobile in Milan

The project was designed by Arter&Citton

An elaborated, innovative, and transversal project: this is Tuby, one of the novelties that the company Arblu will present at the upcoming Salone del Mobile in Milan. A project which is strongly characterized by an autonomous aesthetical concept, and at the same time by an aggregative concept, which interacts with the aesthetical lines of other design proposal.

Developed for the bathroom, Tuby is distinguished by the use of drawn tubular elements made up of die-cast joints and extruded aluminum profiles, which give rise to different stylistic solutions. Tuby's structure can become a seal for the furniture, which positioned between the top and the furniture, embellishes and modernizes it.

On request, it is also possible to add one or two towel rails directly onto the frame. The frame itself can also serve as a support foot to offload weight on the floor.

The contour line that Tuby defines, decisively qualifies the aesthetic of the products, enhancing technical and functional content of the proposals.

Another stylistic innovation, that can be realized thanks to the characteristics of Tuby and its modular system, is the mirror. Tuby in fact becomes the frame for the backlighted mirror, a solution that can be modulated in height and width and that can be equipped with shelves in the lower part and integrated spotlights in the upper part.

Tuby can be also used as a structure for a shelf, a frame onto which a top can be inserted from among those available in the various materials of Arblu catalogue.

Tuby is a project designed by the Arter&Citton studio and conceived with a view to transversality, as it can be adapted to any bathroom furniture composition.
